1. **Introductions, Land acknowledgement, and acceptance of the minutes**, led by Roberta Brown

- i. Land acknowledgement was presented by Roberta.
- 2. **Admin report**, presented by Vice-Principal Lillian

i. New Staffing and Staff Updates

- David joined in January to cover Eva's 5/6class
- Niamh Will be join HPAS in February to cover Daniel's KG class (LTO)
- Andrew Hesp a Child Youth Worker (CYW) will support HPAS and ASPS, working with Chloe.
- Danielle is working with ASPS intermediate teachers on a literacy initiative including reading resources.

ii. Student Voice Committee

- Student Council has four subcommittees, of which Student Voice Committee is to encourage student attention and input
- They have been working on the School Improvement Plan (SIP) and have examined our school as a whole to see how HPAS can be more inclusive for all students.
- Students will share their observations and offering suggestions to Trustee King in the first week of February, during her visit. They have already presented to a group of visiting Principals.
- iii. **Graduation Trip** Students will go to Muskoka Woods from June 11 to 13. The cost is \$500 per student for accommodation and food. Additional funds may be requested for food during travel.

- iv. **African and Chinese Heritage Month** There will be activities/events held in February to celebrate both African and Chinese Heritage.
- v. **Swimming skills** Classes will be conducted for all grade 4 students.
- vi. **Mural** outside of library has been completed.

3. Teacher Report, Presented by Helena and Anastasia

- i. Winter Stations March 4, 2025
 - We will need parent volunteers (all parents should complete vulnerable sector check) https://www.tps.ca/services/police-record-checks/

ii. Yearbook -

- We are experiencing challenges with the yearbook. We need a parent volunteer who can attend lunchtime club
- It has worked best when it is a volunteer led activity. But the nature of the yearbook club we need urgent support. Danielle is teacher supervisor, but has taken on more roles this year (guidance counsellor, heading Intermediate literacy initiative)
 - Volunteer commitment look like (it should be 1 day a week)
 - a. Collecting photos and adding them to the Yearbook program (Creator Studio under the publisher's license)
 - b. Supporting students
- Cover has been selected
- Note: Discussion with Danielle post-meeting indicates that a large part of the problem is technical with the TDSB protections for student accounts resulting in lack of authentication to use the Yearbook program. Danielle winds up signing kids into her account which can take half of the club's time.
- iii. **Grad Sweatshirts/Hoodies** The cost has risen again and teachers are suggesting that students families take on some of the cost. The students want a design with signatures inside a "25". Due to the size of the class the image will be higher resolution than last year to keep smaller signatures crisp higher resolution images cost more to print.
